







This staff amenity space was created from a modern open plan office interior. The client wanted a cutting edge environment to reflect the ethos of the company rather than the bland anonymous interior evident throughout the rest of their building. The Gallery was designed as a minimalist statement and was based on Tate Modern. Walls were constructed to define the area, the ceiling was removed to expose the building services and a versatile lighting system was installed. The standard raised access floor was removed and replaced with a timber tile raised access floor and the existing servery area was remodelled. Special long tables with bench seating was designed and manufactured to reflect the clean simple lines of the interior.





The Projects Company were selected by Daimler Chrysler to fit out their new office complex in Milton Keynes. Komfort's high performance LS90 system was constructed using a combination of steel panels, glazed panels, part glazed panels and glass doors. This pre-manufactured system requires the highest levels of on site co-ordination and installation skill to ensure a perfect job. The Projects Company are one of a handful of companies trained and accredited to install this product. Along with LS90 faceted silicon butt glazing and dry lined walls were installed in feature areas, Projects Joinery supplied timber door sets, architrave and skirting whilst Projects craftsman refurbished the existing staircase. MF ceilings and bulkheads, suspended ceilings, acoustic and fire barriers were installed.

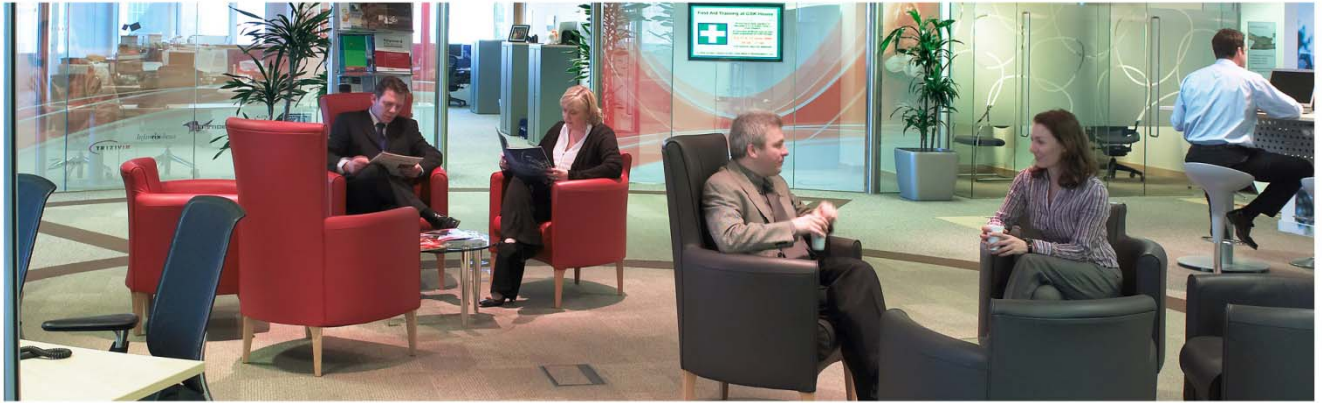

Areas were themed with colour to aid navigation around the space for visitors and this included floor finishes, large format wall graphics and acoustic wall screens.

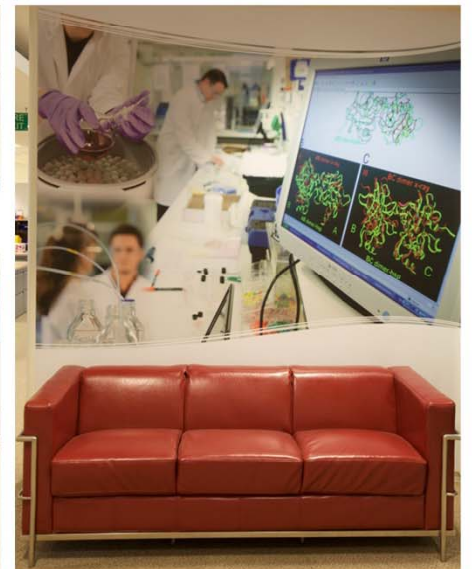
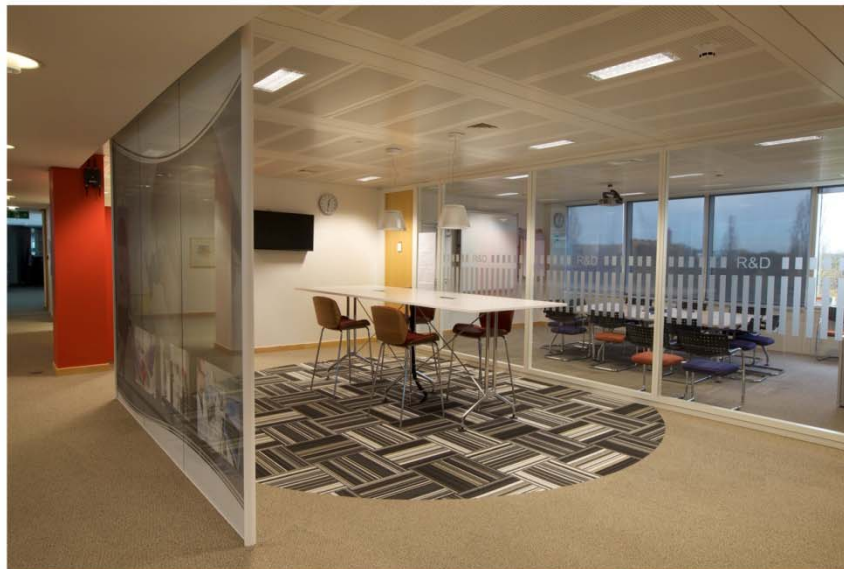




From concept to implementation this recently completed project totally re-modelled the existing traditional office space to provide a flexible, vibrant meeting space to encourage interaction and team building. The area also creates a focal point for product launches and training as well as accommodating international visitors and providing temporary touchdown workstations. The Projects Company developed and supplied special products to exactly meet the needs of the client as well as taking well known GSK brands and converting them into wall decoration and information points.

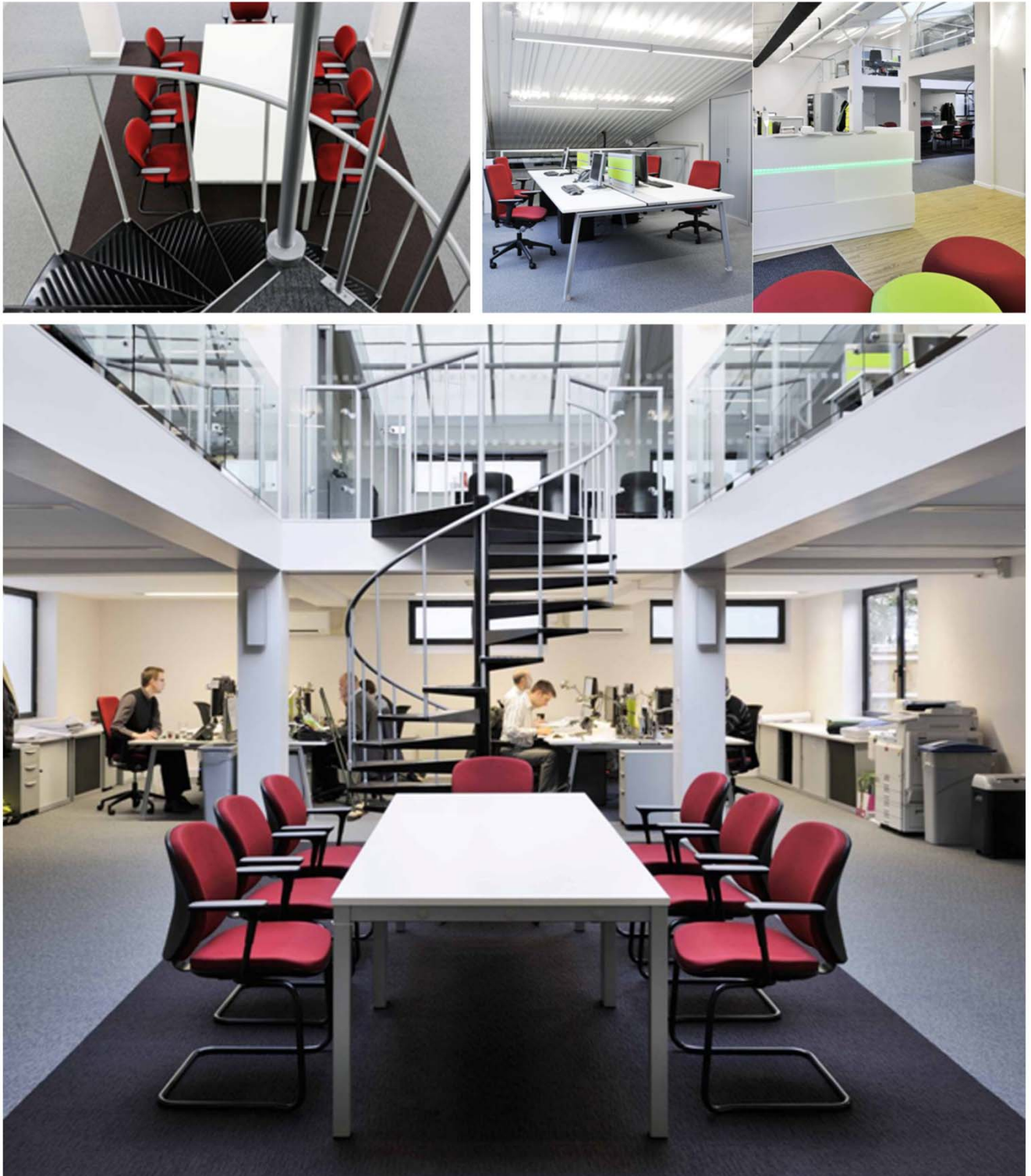
GlaxoSmithKline World Head Quarters, Brentford– Pharma Europe





This project, completed in 2010, created a series of laboratories and meeting spaces for sensory testing studies. The Projects Company carried out all fit out and refurbishment work, supplied furniture in specialist finishes to coordinate with the laboratory spaces. The glass facades to the laboratories were installed with 'switch glass' so that glass could be changed from clear to opaque at the flick of a switch. Large format graphics were designed with the clients input to illustrate the work carried out by Scitec.





The original building was stripped out and completely re-furbished. The Projects Company project managed the complete works from a complete re-wire and supply of all electrical fittings to mechanical works including air conditioning. The space was then re-decorated and solid walls erected to form kitchen and toilet amenities along with the creation of cellular office accommodation from glazed partitions. New glass balustrades were installed and carpet fitting and furniture installation project managed.



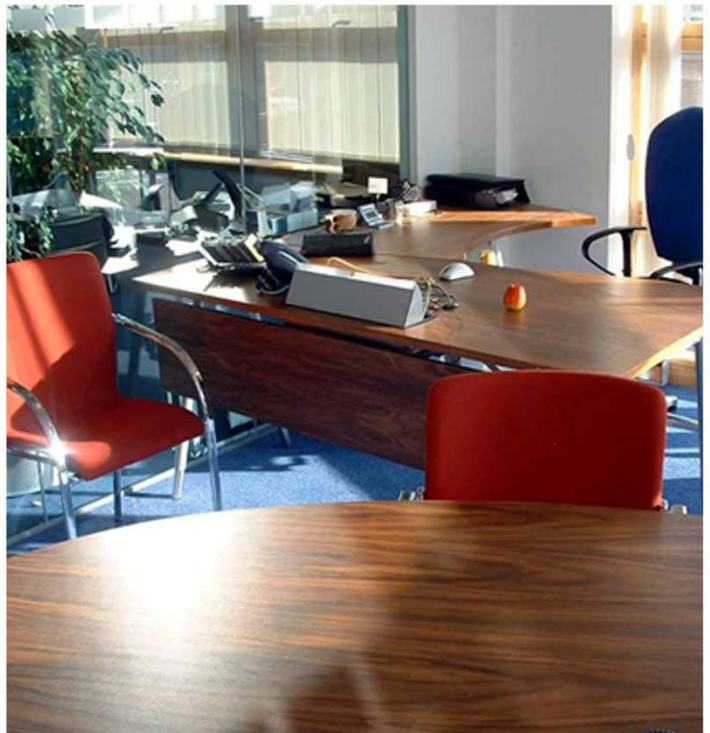
Design and build services were provided to achieve a combination of office and laboratory spaces. The Projects Company has vast experience within this specialist sector after many years working for clients on Oxford and Cambridge Science Parks.





Working in close collaboration with Spratley Architects this stylish interior was created. Minimalist glazing and simple white walls with a high gloss floor were mixed with the strong green accent colour of the reception desk and screen. American black walnut veneer work surfaces and frame details along with frosted glass added richness to this simple space. The Projects Company carried out all fit out work which had to be of the highest quality in this minimalist interior.





Hutchison 3g is the leading company in the UK that has developed, and first to launch worldwide, a 3g multi media mobile communication product. Its major share holder is Hutchison Whampoa a multinational conglomerate based in Hong Kong. H3g started from a zero property base in 2000, it now occupies over 450,000 sq ft of office, contact centre, data centre and retail outlet space in the UK.

The Projects Company was invited to tender in October 2001 for product supply and special projects. This tender was won and since that time The Projects Company has assisted in design and build of senior management office suites and boardrooms in two locations, the design and supply of bespoke furniture for a 24/7 network monitoring complex. Also bespoke layout and product supply for a 24/7 contact centre in Glasgow, and supply in excess of over 3,000 flexible workstations and storage at five locations throughout the UK.

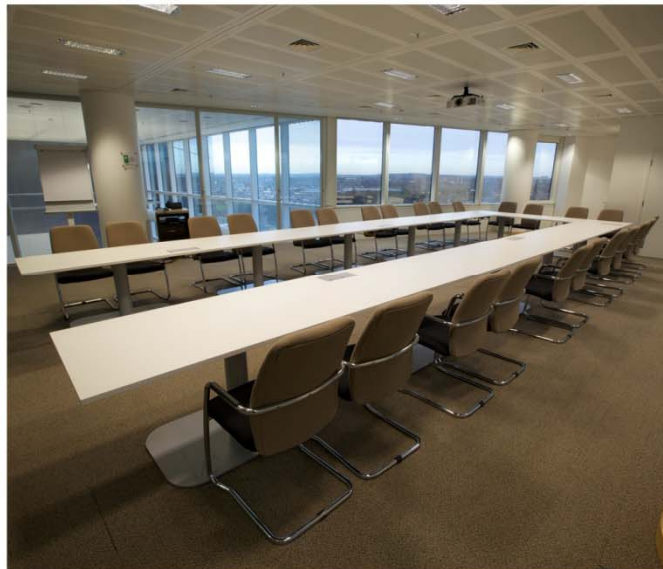
The Projects Company continues to be a preferred supplier to '3' for its generic layout and operation maintenance support in these areas. The company has established a seamless integration with '3' with team commitment and delivery that the client can work with and trust. Our aim is to continue in having a long term relationship with the client. To date the value of this work has been £5.5 million.





The Projects Company designed and built the interior for Dicom's new UK Headquarters building in Basingstoke. Working closely with the client colour, finish and graphic schemes along with layouts for office, training and staff amenity spaces were developed. Furniture options were presented and a short list of products selected, showroom visits were arranged and selected to ensure the finished solution met the aspirations of the client.





Completed in 2010 The Projects Company re-modelled the space to create a series of glass fronted rooms and booths with modular tables and cantilever seating. In order to reduce the number of table bases required and provide connectivity at the worksurface special cable managed bases were designed specifically for the project. the Projects Company project managed the provision of power, data, AV, lighting, HVAC and all life safety systems to the space along with floor finishes, furniture, glass partitions and manifestation.



The Projects Company designed and built this central London showroom for Komfort Workspace. The space was previously a car park and therefore required extensive re-modelling to incorporate access, kitchen and toilet facilities as well as a high specification environment in which to display product aimed at the London Architect and Design community. The M & E was a major part of the project stripping out redundant heating systems and installing climate control along with a complex lighting and audio visual scheme.





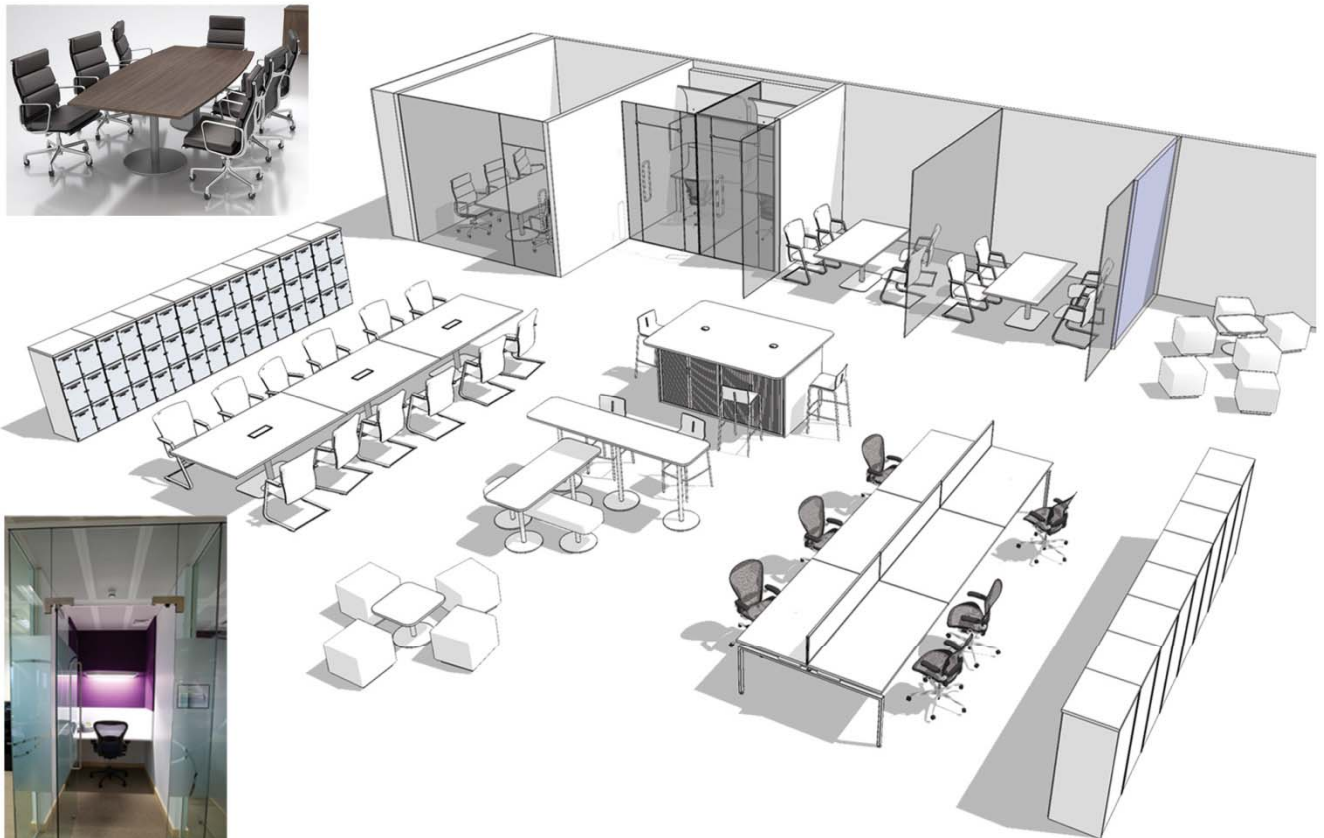
This vibrant space was created for the GSK I.T department and combined bright colors, themed large format wall graphics, innovative furniture solutions, carpet insets and glazed colored glass partitions to create task related work settings. Large runs of benching for desk sharing and brightly colored personal lockers were also supplied to complete the re-modelled environment.





Stoke Park is a prestigious country club with lounges, golf course and fitness complex set on a country estate near Stoke Poges. The client wanted to extend the lounge facilities within the health & fitness building out into the gym area. The Projects Company designed a free standing glass screen with integrated balustrade to define the space then carried out and project managed the installation. Film was then applied to the screen to give visual privacy and a 'Superman' graphic added, the image was photographed from an original Andy Warhol owned by the club and applied to the glass.





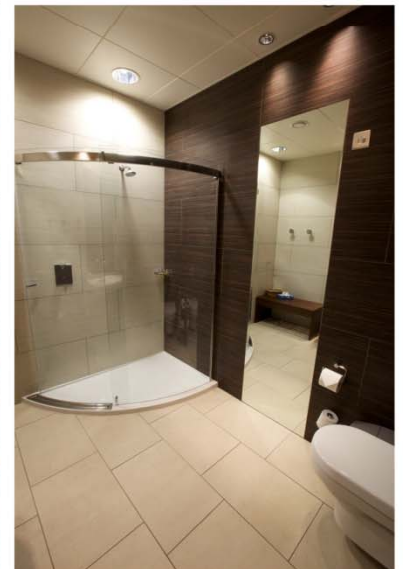
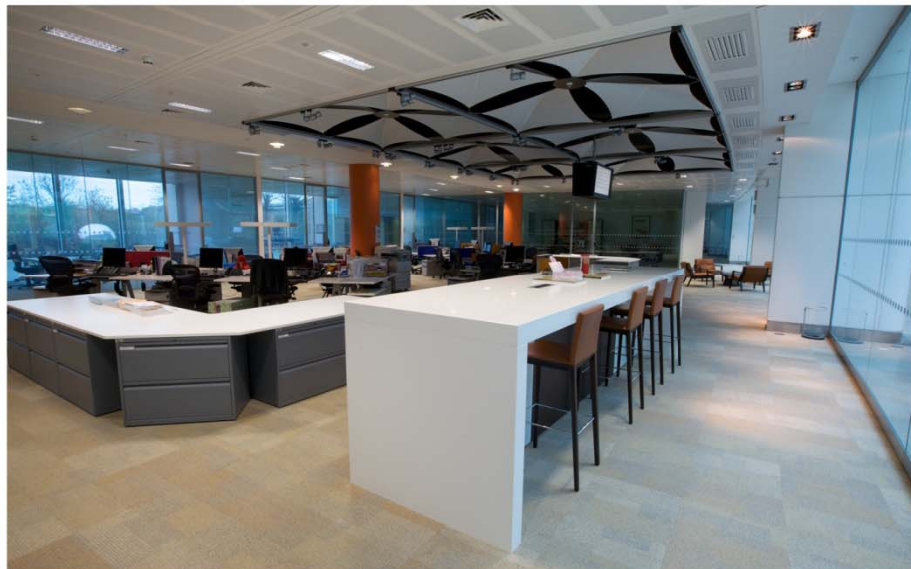
We have worked at GlaxoSmithKline World Headquarters in Brentford for over 8 years and much of this work involved re-modelling existing spaces as part of GSK's 'SmartSpace' projects. The implementation of this desk sharing and task focused work setting philosophy has required the development of special solutions and products. This case study highlights some of those product solutions.



We carry out interior design, construction and maintenance for GSK at their world headquarters building in Brentford. The site is 1 million sq ft with 0.75 million sq ft of office space and meeting environments accommodating 3,500 people plus visitors from around the world. The standard of design, implementation and service has to be of the highest order in this land mark building. All of our work is implemented outside normal office hours and is coordinated by our own site based project manager working in close liaison with the GSK Facilities Management

GlaxoSmithKline World Head Quarters, Brentford – Quiet Booths



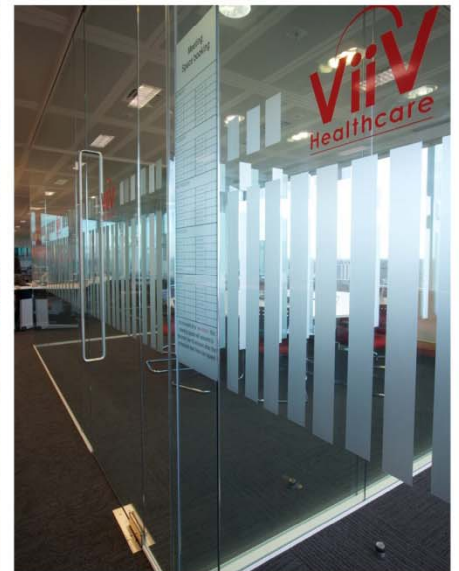


In 2008 a new CEO was appointed and required that the Chief Executive Team (CET) were relocated within the corporate headquarters, The Projects Company were appointed Principal Contractors. TPC managed the delivery of this high specification project including the supply and installation of all products including a specialist ceiling system, high performance acoustic partitions, power and data connectivity, bomb proof film to external windows and furniture including be-spoke furniture solutions.



A series of brightly coloured dry lined curved walls were created. The walls incorporated be-spoke display cabinets and lighting at plinth level to give the illusion that the walls were floating above the ground. Facetted silicon butt structural glass was then installed around the walls and full floor to ceiling glass with inset frameless glass doors completed the meeting room enclosure. The room was then furnished with a modular table system, audio visual equipment and wall mounted glass dry wipe boards and flip charts all supplied by The Projects Company.





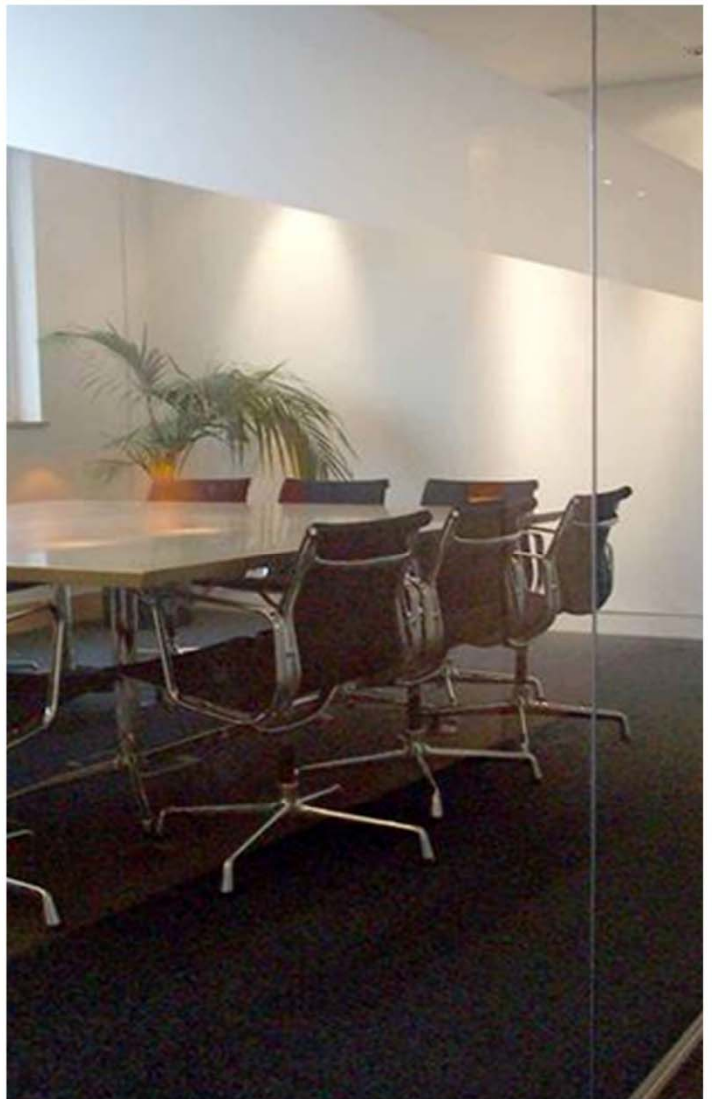
ViiV is a joint venture between GSK and Pfizer and created a business targeted at the development of HIV medication. The Projects Company were selected for the fit out working closely with the client and their Designers. TPC completed the delivery of the project which included floor finishes, proprietary and be-spoke furniture including the refurbishment of existing products to match in with the selected scheme. This encompassed re-upholstery of chairs and replacement worksurfaces and storage tops. TPC also supplied large back painted glass wall panels for use as dry wipe boards.





Our work at GlaxoSmithKline World Headquarters has led to the design and installation of a number of special project rooms. These rooms are used to display product, provide a focal point for special projects and provide a creative environment away from the normal office area. A number of special pieces of furniture were designed and supplied from glass benches providing power and data connectivity to a special meeting table styled to look like a supermarket check-out. Lounging areas, pinable walls, dry wipe walls and presentation areas allow the free exchange of ideas and promote problem solving.





The Projects Company were appointed to fit – out the offices of MEPC one of the worlds major business premises development companies.

This is one of many projects completed for MEPC on the Milton Science Park. Our work on this site covers a period of 8 years and 21 projects with the quality of our work and our project management capability ensuring we are invited back again and again.





This project included workplace analysis studies, storage survey and space utilisation study to identify the exact client requirements for their new building. Once again a design and build service was provided creating a combination of open plan and cellular office space along with meeting rooms, large conference room with a movable wall, reception and staff amenity space was provided along with large format graphics in key areas around the building.





This recently completed project involved the complete fit out of new office and warehouse space for The Pier. Ceilings, lighting, carpets and specialist timber flooring were all supplied and installed along with VRV systems, fire alarms, intruder alarms, door entry system and ventilation. A combination of dry lined solid walls and silicon butt glazed facades incorporating frameless glass doors provided the cellular office space. Staff amenity services were also supplied and installed in a project worth £600k.
